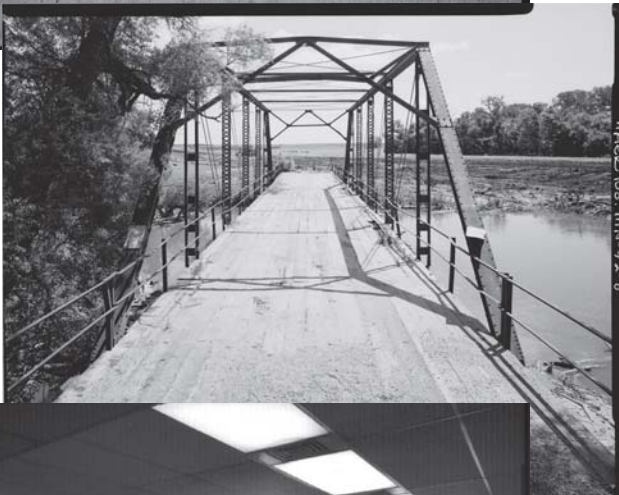
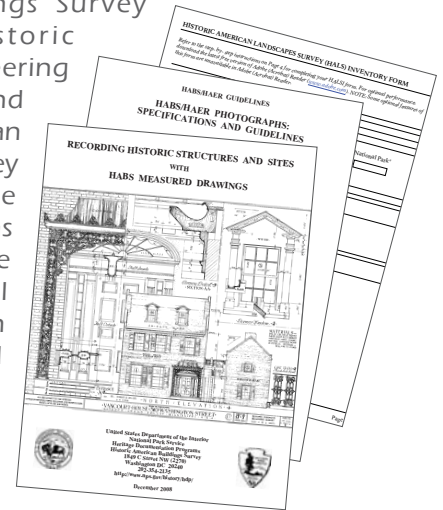


HABS/HAER/HALS Documentation

Local, State, and Federal Resources



As more historic resources are being affected by transportation, energy, and development projects, balancing planning needs and preservation strategies is important. The 106 Group can provide efficient and cost-saving cultural resources documentation for planning or mitigation. We often assist with the Heritage Documentation Programs administered by the National Park Service that include the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER), and the Historic American Landscapes Survey (HALS). Under the provisions of sections 106 and 110b of the amended National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, federal agencies sometimes produce HABS/HAER/HALS documentation for properties that are listed, or are eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places in order to mitigate the adverse effects of federal actions such as demolition or substantial alteration.



The 106 Group regularly completes HABS and HAER documentation for mitigation. A select list of our HABS/HAER projects include a HABS documentation of the Federal Reserve Bank Building in Minneapolis, Minnesota, as well as numerous HAER documentations of historic bridges.

We have a thorough knowledge of historic landscapes, their features, and their significance, which is required to complete HALS documentation. In addition, the 106 Group is currently working with the National Park Service to create an agricultural landscapes survey brief to supplement the "National Register Bulletin 24: Guidelines for Local Surveys" and "National Register Bulletin 30: Guidelines for Evaluating and Documenting Rural Historic Landscapes."
