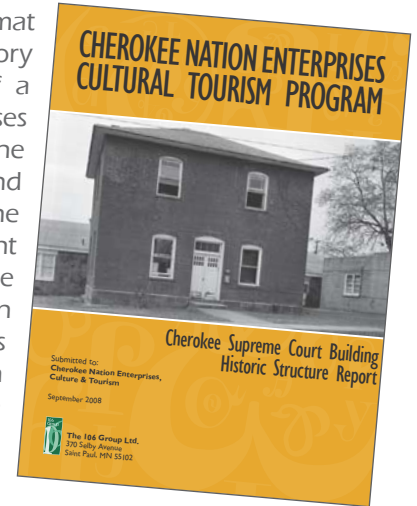


Historic Structures Reports

Local, State, and Federal Resources



A Historic Structures Report (HSR) is an important and effective tool for planning the preservation, management, and reuse of a historic property. An HSR provides information in a graphic and written format that documents the history and existing condition of a property. It also addresses management goals for the reuse of the property and provides direction on the most appropriate treatment of the property during the forthcoming preservation effort. An HSR provides guidance on the restoration and/or rehabilitation of the property and its long-term maintenance.



The 106 Group has extensive experience completing HSRs. Recently, the 106 Group, in partnership with the project architect, prepared an HSR for the Cherokee Nation Supreme Court, a symbolic structure in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, the capitol of the Cherokee Nation. The 106 Group has also prepared HSRs in partnership with local architects for the Split Rock Lighthouse dwellings on Lake Superior and Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr.'s boyhood home and ice house, and an associated Works Progress Administration shelter in Little Falls, Minnesota.
